The Easter season is upon us, and I can't wait to proclaim, "He is Risen, He has Risen Indeed". In the book of Joshua, he demonstrated the theme of victory and conquest. The name, Joshua, is a variation of the name, "Jesus." God used Joshua to fulfill the promise he made to Abraham about a land for His covenant people. God used Jesus Christ to bring everlasting victory to all of His people forever. Joshua was a great leader and he always spoke truth and encouraged the people of Israel at every turn. Joshua knew that God was always fighting for the Israelites, and it was his job to remind the people of this. Once the land was occupied, Joshua who was now very old and near death, reminded the people that God gave them a land they did not labor for, and cities they did not build, though they live in them; they are eating from vineyards and olive groves they did not plant (Joshua 24:13). Joshua challenges the people one last time. Joshua 24:14-15, 14 "Therefore, fear the LORD and worship him in sincerity and truth. Get rid of the gods your ancestors worshiped beyond the Euphrates River and in Egypt, and worship the LORD. 15 But if it doesn't please you to worship the LORD, choose for yourselves today: Which will you worship—the gods your ancestors worshiped beyond the Euphrates River or the gods of the Amorites in whose land you are living? As for me and my family, we will worship the LORD." To be honest with you, the book of Joshua does not end on a positive note. Joshua's last recorded words are written to admonish the people to get rid of the foreign gods that are among them and turn their hearts to God. We must always be diligent to not loose sight of God, and His plan for each of us individually and corporately. Today, pray for yourself and for God's church, FBC Bryan, to remain focused on God's redemptive plan through Jesus Christ or Lord. Remember the words of Joshua at the beginning of the conquest of the promised land, Joshua 1:6-9 "Be strong and courageous, for you will distribute the land I swore to their ancestors to give them as an inheritance. 7 Above all, be strong and very courageous to observe carefully the whole instruction my servant Moses commanded you. Do not turn from it to the right or the left, so that you will have success wherever you go. 8 This book of instruction must not depart from your mouth; you are to meditate on[a] it day and night so that you may carefully observe everything written in it. For then you will prosper and succeed in whatever you do. 9 Haven't I commanded you: be strong and courageous? Do not be afraid or discouraged, for the LORD your God is with you wherever you go." What better way to rejoice at this Easter season than to celebrate the resurrection and the promise that God is with us forever. See you Sunday! David
