We all have our issues in life, good and not so good. The words of this Psalm encourage me because the God I love, worship, and adore is sovereign over all creation. His name is majestic in all the earth. When Jesus was instructing the twelve, he said, "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you have no life in you. 54 Whoever feeds on my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him up on the last day. 55 For my flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink. 56 Whoever feeds on my flesh and drinks my blood abides in me, and I in him". (John 6) After Jesus shared these hard truths, many turned away from Him and never walked with Him again. So, he asked the twelve, "Do you want to go as well?" But Peter said to Jesus what we need to say today, "Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life, 69 and we have believed, and have come to know, that you are the Holy One of God."
