Happy Grandparents Day!! Sunday, September 7.

In 1969, nine-year-old Russell Capper sent President Richard Nixon a letter suggesting that a day should be set aside to celebrate grandparents. Russell's letter was rejected because it lacked a Congressional resolution. On June 12, 1969, he received a letter back from Rose Mary Woods — Personal Secretary to the President — reading, "Dear Russell, Thank you for your letter to President Nixon. Your suggestion regarding a Grandparent's Day is appreciated, but the President ordinarily issues proclamations designating periods for special observance only when a Congressional resolution authorizes him to do so. With best wishes, Sincerely, Rose Mary Woods Personal Secretary to the President." Following this letter, Marian McQuade was recognized nationally by the U.S. Senate and by President Jimmy Carter as the founder of National Grandparents Day. McQuade wanted to educate the youth about the importance of seniors and the contributions they have made throughout history. She urged the youth to "adopt" a grandparent and learn more about their lives, challenges, and desires for the future. In 1977, Senator Randolph, with the help of other senators, introduced a joint resolution to the senate requesting the president to "issue annually a proclamation designating the first Sunday of September after Labor Day of each year as 'National Grandparents' Day". Congress passed the legislation, proclaiming the first Sunday after Labor Day as National Grandparent's Day. On August 3, 1978, Jimmy Carter signed the proclamation, and the day was finally celebrated the following year. God honors older adults: Proverbs 16:31 "Gray hair is a crown of glory; it is gained in a righteous life". Proverbs 20:29 "The glory of young men is their strength, but the splendor of old men is their gray hair". Think about the accomplishments of old men and women in the scripture; Noah was 600 when God flooded the earth, Abraham was 100 and Sarah was 90 when Isaac was born, Moses was 80 when he led the, Israelites out of Egypt. Zechariah and Elizabeth were in their 60's when they gave birth to John the Baptist. God had a plan for all these older men and women, and He has a plan for us. As I grow older, I'm asking God, "what next". God, what is in store for me in the 4th guarter of life? Today, I claim 2 Corinthians 4:16, "So do not lose heart. Though our outer self is wasting away, our inner self is being renewed day by day". Lord God, as my body slows and changes, renew my spirit day by day. Teach me to walk in gentleness, patience, and gratitude. Let my gray hair be a crown of glory, not for my sake, but as a testimony of Your faithfulness.
