In Hebrews 11:1, faith is described as "confidence in what we hope for and assurance about what we do not see." Since our church split ten plus years ago, my faith in God has never diminished. This morning, my devotional was entitled "The Faith of Joseph." Matthew 1:20, "As he considered these things, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream, saying, "Joseph, son of David, do not fear to take Mary as your wife, for that which is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit." In Joseph's dream, God shined his light on him and directed him not to deny Mary. Joseph, facing complicated implications, took Mary as his wife even though she was with child. This would have been scandalous in these days, a curse on Mary and her family, punishable by public disgrace, expulsion from the community, or even death. But Joseph, knowing the divine nature of Mary's condition, accepted Mary and all was well. People would still talk but Joseph and Mary, being betrothed (engaged) were allowed to be married. In this era, to be engaged was legally binding as marriage. When Joseph discovered Mary was pregnant, he did not want her publicly shamed. Since engagement was a legal agreement, he was willing to divorce her secretly. However, when God communicated with him through the dream, everything changed. He knew God was at work. By faith, Joseph took Mary as his wife. 1 What great faith Joseph had! What about my faith, our faith? I've never had an angel come to me physically, but I still have faith in God. In John 20:29 Jesus say's to Thomas, "Because you have seen me, you have believed; blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed." My prayer today for myself, my family, and the church is that God would give me the kind of faith that never sees but always receives. Bless this day, bless my family, and bless your church. God, shine your light on me today and allow me to step into it. I pray that I will always accept your light and never turn away from it. "Faith is a leap into the light not a step into the darkness."


